

Clinical Characteristics of Patients with Gastroparesis

Of the 146 patients seen at Tertiary Motility Centres in the United States, 18% were males and 82% were females. The mean age of symptom onset was 34 years of age. The predominating symptom—reported by 92% of these patients—was nausea. The next most commonly reported symptom—by 84% of patients—was vomiting. Other symptoms included bloating as reported by 75% of patients, early satiety (a feeling of fullness after just a few bites of food) reported by 60%; and abdominal pain reported by 46%.

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
